

**PUBLIC NOTICE**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Sagaponack on the 15th day of February, 2023 adopted the following local law:

**LOCAL LAW NO. 1 OF 2023**

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTIONS 245-42 (B)  
REGARDING THE PERMISSIBLE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF SAGAPONACK AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this local law is to clarify the application of pyramid restrictions to structures located in Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) flood zones.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT/ENACTMENT.

Village Code Sections 245-42 (B) is amended and enacted as follows:

§ 245-42 HEIGHT.

B. Pyramid law. For the purpose of this chapter, when determining the pyramid of a building or other structure it shall be measured as follows:

- (1) All buildings or other structures on any lot in any district must be set back from all property lines so that the height of any point of the building or other structure is not greater than the horizontal distance

of the point from the nearest property line at grade to the building or other structure at that location.

- (2) All buildings or other structures on any lot in any AE or VE Zone as shown on the applicable Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency for the Village of Sagaponack, the elevation for the application of the pyramid law will be existing grade plus 2 feet at the property line.

Notwithstanding any language in this subsection, the maximum height limitation for a building or other structure in the Table of Dimensional Regulations at the end of this chapter shall not be exceeded at any point unless the structure is one exempted under Subsection A hereof. An illustration depicting a typical elevation view showing the control of height of buildings and structures under this subsection is included at the end of this chapter.

### SECTION 3. SEQRA.

This is a Type II action under 6 NYCRR § 617.5(C)(26).

### SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY.

Should any part or provision of this local law be decided by the courts to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the local law as a

whole nor any part thereof other than the part so decided to be unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State as provided by law.
